ANet is an education nonprofit that helps schools boost student learning with great teaching-teaching that's grounded in standards, informed by data, and built on the successful practices of educators around the country.

ANet was founded over a decade ago in response to the need expressed by educators for timely, practical, actionable data on student learning—in contrast to backwards-looking year-end, highstakes tests.

ANet provides tools and expertise that empower school leaders to set, measure, and meet practice goals that boost student learning. With resolute leadership and a culture of continuous improvement, schools can support and empower their teachers, students, and communities.

Why we do what we do

ANet is a nonprofit founded on the premise that every child in America deserves an excellent education and the opportunities it provides. But the current reality looks quite different:

Race and socio-economics are linked in America: 23% of the Hispanic/Latino population and 26% of the black population lived in poverty 2007–11, compared with 12% of the white population.¹

Socio-economics matters in educational outcomes: Young people from high income families earn bachelor's degrees at seven times the rate of those from low-income families.² Whites attain Bachelor's degrees at two times the rate of blacks and three times that of Latinos/Hispanics.3

Education plays a significant role in determining opportunity:

Higher educational attainment (Bachelor's degree or above) correlates with higher earnings and lower unemployment rates. (Bureau of Labor Statistics)



TEACHERS

Enabling you to reach every student

Teachers have no shortage of people giving them advice or making demands on their time. What they need is fewer distractions and more practical support to help them with what they care most about—meeting the needs of all their students.

ANet provides you with **practical** guidance, user-friendly data tools, and **resources** screened for quality and alignment with rigorous standards, including the Common Core.

Our partner schools give their students brief interim assessments on recently-taught material in ELA and math. Unlike year-end tests, these assessments produce data to inform ongoing instruction—not to evaluate teachers or students.

Our simple but powerful online data **tools** allow you to identify areas that need to be retaught or reinforced,

which students need extra support. and what confusions they may have. We then provide access to **curated** resources, including planning guides and complete lesson plans, targeting relevant concepts and skills.

SCHOOL LEADERS

Not just another initiative or program

School leaders have a daunting set of responsibilities. ANet's tools and services are designed not to be another demand on your time, but to ensure you make the most effective use of that time.

Coaches confer on-site with our partner schools around 20 times a year. Early in the year, they learn about your school and work with you to set goals for improvements in your school's practices and your students' performance.

To meet those goals, you and your coach work together to implement a strong **teaching and learning cycle**—which includes planning from deep knowledge of standards and timely reviews of student achievement data from our interim assessments.

Your coach also serves as a thought partner to advance your instructional **priorities** and create routines and structures for your staff to reflect on what worked, why, and what lessons can be carried forward.

"One and done" is not enough

Every experienced educator has been through enough PD events to know that, no matter how inspiring the presenter or intriguing the ideas, they rarely lead to meaningful change. Assimilating new practices simply takes more sustained focus and energy.

That's why a key component of ANet's partnership with schools is to provide a coach who partners closely with school leaders throughout the year to support each school's implementation of standards and data best practices—in ways that fit into each school's unique strengths and mission.

Our coaches, all former teachers and school leaders, are experts in data-driven practices and fluent in the use of ANet's

products and services. They learn about a school's needs, priorities, and existing routines, then work with school leaders to strengthen habits and practices from that starting point.

ANet provides formative interim assessments that give educators timely, actionable, and student-specific data.

We meticulously develop assessment questions that align to the standards and demands of state summative assessments. This not only enables teachers to know which standards students are mastering and which they aren't, but also deepens their understanding of the standards.

The data from our assessments don't capture only right and wrong—they provide insight into which students are struggling, with what, and why. So you can take targeted action to meet the specific needs of your students.





As a nonprofit organization, our goals are the same as yours: to help educators build stronger practice and help students learn.


Improving practice

We use researched-based rubrics to measure the quality of practice related to planning and data use in our partner schools. Of the schools that began working with ANet in 2010, the most recent group for which we have three years of data, **over 90% improved their practice** by at least one rubric level (out of four) and 30% improved by two levels.

Since 2005, we've helped set up 495,578 students for success.

Helping students learn

Students in schools that are building their practice achieve gains. Looking at that same 2010 cohort of partner schools, those that improved their practice have seen gains of nearly 7% in ELA and 15% in math.



For each of the last three years, ANet's partner schools have consistently achieved roughly **two times the gains of their state's average**; in 2012-13 the top quartile of ANet's schools made four times the gains or more. Our results have proven replicable across governance structures, starting student proficiency levels, and length of relationship with ANet.
